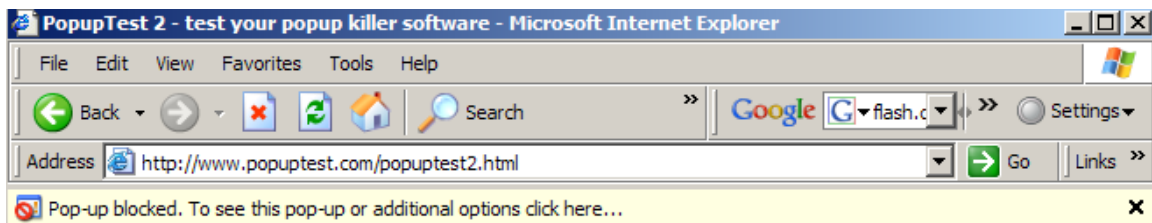


Enabling Popups in Internet Explorer

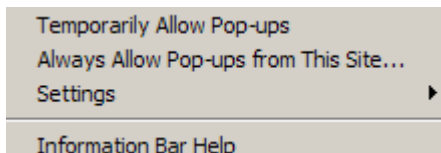
What are Popups?

Popup windows, or popups, are windows that appear automatically without your permission. They vary in size but usually don't cover the whole screen. Some popups open on top of the current window, while others appear underneath Internet Explorer (popunders). Popup blocking is turned on by default, so you don't have to worry about enabling it to prevent popups from appearing in Internet Explorer.

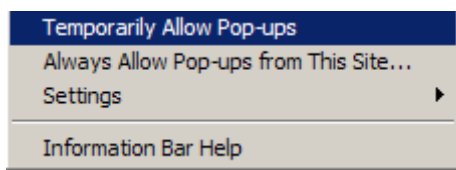
Some web sites, including some banking sites, use popups for important features. However, many websites also use pop-ups as web spam, to advertise. Blocking all popups disables all such features. To allow specific web sites to use popups, while blocking all others, you can add specific web sites to the list of allowed sites. Internet Explorer does a fair job of identifying legitimate pop-up windows and allowing them to appear, but you may an instance where it blocks a window you need to access. If that happens, your web browser will look like this:



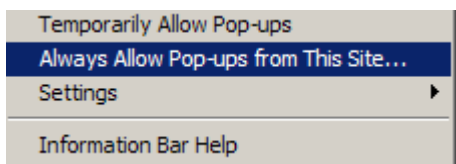
When blocking a popup, Internet Explorer displays an information bar. Click anywhere on the yellow bar, and the following drop down menu will appear:



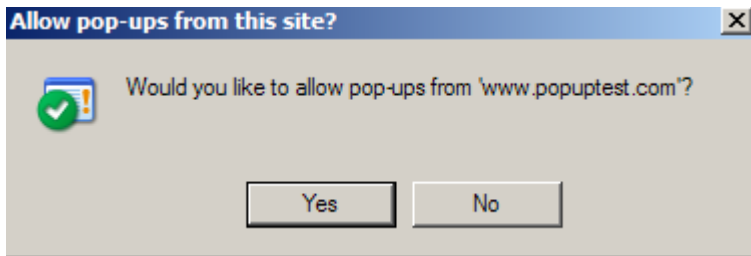
If you are unsure if you want the popups, click **Temporarily Allow Pop-ups**. This will allow the pop-up to appear this time only while you view the web page.



Once you are confident you always want to see popups from this site, the next time you go to the web page, click anywhere on the yellow bar, and select **Always Allow Pop-ups from this Site...**



The following confirmation screen will appear:



Click **Yes**.

You have now enabled pop-ups from that site each time you visit it.
